Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for April

Crime

Of the 53 crimes recorded for March in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT, there have been the following incidents:

Burglary Residential – 3

Between 11th & 12th March a home on Winslow Drive was entered after a conservatory window was smashed giving access to the key in the door. Between 12th & 15th March a home on Hume Brae was entered after a conservatory door was prised open. It is unknown if anything was stolen. Between 10th & 20th March a home on Winslow Drive was entered after a rear door was forced open. Cash was stolen.

Burglary Commercial – 1

An attempt was made to enter the Immingham Golf Club by forcing a metal window shutter. No entry was made.

Vehicle Crime – 3

Overnight 8th & 9th March, fuel was stolen from a large number of trucks parked in three separate compounds at the Kiln Lane Industrial Estate. During the evening of 20th March a car parked up on Ings Lane was entered. Property was stolen.

Damage - 5

Muirfield Croft car set alight.

A180 object dropped from a bridge onto a car being driven.

Pelham Road damage to a computer after argument between two people. Woodlands Avenue damage to a bike after it was stamped on by a known person.

Kiln Lane damage to compound fencing.
