Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for December

Crime

Of the 45 crimes recorded for November in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT, there have been the following incidents:

Burglary Residential - 4

During the afternoon of 8th November a home on Stallingborough Road was broken into after smashing a living room window. Jewellery was stolen.

On the same day a home on Clyfton Crescent was broken into after a bedroom window was prised open. Cash and jewellery was stolen.

Between 6th & 9th November patio doors were smashed to gain entry to a home on Highland Tarn. A mobile phone was stolen.

Between 3rd & 9th November patio doors were again smashed to gain entry to a neighbouring home on Highland Tarn. Jewellery was stolen.

Burglary Commercial – 2

Over the weekend of 1st & 4th November a haulage yard on the Stallingborough Industrial Estate was entered. Four containers were entered after holes were cut into the side walls. It appears nothing was stolen.

About 11.30pm on 21st November a business on Manby Road Industrial Estate was broken into by forcing open a roller shutter. Cash was stolen from the office.

Vehicle Crime - 4

Overnight 2nd & 3rd November a compound at the Catch training centre was entered and a mini bus stolen. The vehicle was later found in the Lincs Police area stripped down and the engine removed. The shell was burnt out. Between 5am & 7am on 9th November two cars were stolen from the Kia compound at Stallingborough.

During the afternoon of 14th November a rear number plate was stolen from a car parked outside Canon Peter Hall School on Pelham Road.

Number plates were stolen from a car parked on Kinloch Way overnight 23rd & 24th November.

Washdyke Lane carpark wing mirror kicked off a car.

Kennedy Way car bodywork 'keyed' along its length.

Blair Walk van door damaged.

Hawthorn Avenue paint sprayed on to a garden fence.

St Andrews Church damage to wooden crosses.

Three domestic related criminal damages.

Shop Theft – 5

Other crime include:

Several thousands of pounds worth of toys were stolen from a trailer parked at the Kiln Lane Industrial Estate overnight 1st & 2nd November.

A male shopper in Jacks drops a large amount of money whilst paying for goods at the tills before leaving. On realising what had happened, he returned to the store to recover the cash, but it had been taken. The store CCTV revealed a female picking up the money and making no effort to either contact the victim or hand it in. Enquiries are ongoing to identify the female.

Kennedy Way YCA x 5.

Pelham Road issues with a group of school girls known to the occupant.

Church Lane vehicles revving engines and racing on the road.

One neighbour dispute.
