## Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for March

### Crime

There were 38 crimes recorded for February in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT.

These included:

#### Commercial Burglary:

On 4<sup>th</sup> February offenders used a vehicle to smash their way through shutters into a warehouse at the South Humber Bank Power Station. Once inside, they have loaded the vehicle with a number of turbine blades, then left the site.

#### Criminal Damage 4:

Three tyres were slashed on a car parked on Stallingborough Road.

The windscreen, drivers window and wing mirror were smashed on a car parked on Margaret Street.

A plant pot was smashed at an address on Bluestone Lane.

Named youths caused damage to the trolley bay at Home Bargains.

On 10<sup>th</sup> February offenders attach straps to gates at a compound at Scandinavian Way, Kiln Lane Trading Estate. Using a forklift, they pulled the gate from its hinges. Once inside the compound, CCTV wires were cut, and a trailer was stolen.

Other crime includes:

Ten assaults.

Four shop thefts, two with the same named suspect.

Four reports of sending malicious communications.

Three offences of harassment.

Two minor public order offences.

Two offences of making off without payment for fuel.

There have been six incidents of ASB reported.

Two reports of youths causing issues around the Washdyke lane stores and carparks.

Issues of drones being flown in the vicinity of the municipal tip on Queens Road.

Youths causing issues on Homestead Park.

Youths letting off fireworks at Green Lane.

Youths throwing eggs at properties on Hadleigh Road.
