Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for May

Crime

Of the 56 crimes recorded for April in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT, there have been the following incidents:

Burglary Residential – 4

Between 1st & 3rd April an attempt was made top break in to a property on Church Lane. No entry was made. A day later the property was entered. A car was stolen.

Between 5th & 7th April a property on Highfield Avenue was entered after smashing a window. Tools and games console was stolen.

During the late evening of 16th April, an empty property on Langley Walk was attacked attempting to force the shutter and UPVC door.

Burglary Commercial – 4

Between 5th & 8th April entry was made to a storage yard on the Stallingborough Industrial Estate. An attempt was then made to break in to locked containers. No entry was made.

Overnight 14th & 15th April the Immingham Golf Club premises was entered by forcing windows. Property was stolen.

About 3am on 22nd April an attempt was made to enter an electricity substation on Queens Road. The intruders were disturbed by security officers. Just after midnight of 17th April Jacks Store was broken into. A variety of electrical items were stolen. Four males were arrested in connection with this offence.

Vehicle Crime - 6

During the late evening of 16th April, a van parked on Station Road, Stallingborough was entered. Tools were stolen.

Overnight 19th & 20th a moped was stolen from a garden on Ings Lane. It was recovered nearby.

During the early hours of 23rd April three insecure cars parked on a driveway on Clyfton Crescent were entered and searched. Nothing was stolen.

Shop Theft – 6

Three males have been charged with theft in relation to three of these offences.

Another male has been dealt with for possession of cannabis after being found with the drug on Winslow Drive.
