Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for November

Crime

There were 75 crimes recorded for October in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT.

These included:

Domestic Burglary 2:

On 10th October two men were seen to enter an unoccupied address on Langley Walk through an open window and leave with electrical items.

On 17th October, a family member of the victim used a door key stolen on a previous visit, to enter the victims home on Pilgrim Avenue without permission whilst he was out. The premises were searched. It is not believed anything was stolen.

Commercial Burglary 2:

On 13th October a container at a business unit on Manby Road was broken into. High value tools were stolen.

Four youths have been arrested following a break-in at the old Immingham Golf Club.

Vehicle Crime 2:

A Ford Fiesta car was stolen from its driveway overnight 7th & 8th October.

During the evening of 8th October an Audi car was involved in a single vehicle collision on Stallingborough Road. The driver made off from the scene. The following morning this car was reported stolen overnight from the Washdyke Lane car park.

Criminal Damage 8:

Immingham Golf Club x2.

Damage caused to the brickwork of Jacks Store x2.

Double glazed door pane smashed at a house on Hollingsworth Avenue.

A police vehicle was damaged when a known youth punched the wing mirror.

Car windows smashed on a car parked on Hadleigh Road.

Damage caused to a garden fence at Sonja Crest.

Other crime includes:

Two trailers were stolen from the lorry park off Pelham Road. They were recovered from near Bilborough Top Services on the A64.

Nickel was stolen from a compound on Immingham Dock.

A large number of drums containing cable was stolen from a company compound on Laporte Road Stallingborough.

A male was arrested for a racially aggravated public order offence after he approached police officers dealing with another matter totally unconnected with this male and began shouting racial abuse towards one of the officers.

Seventeen other public order offences.

Thirteen assaults.

Eight Shop Thefts.

Four offences of sending malicious communications.

ASB 15:

Youths causing annoyance in the vicinity of the stores on Washdyke Lane & Kennedy Way x4.

Motorbikes being ridden illegally x2.

Youths causing annoyance at various locations around Immingham including Sonja Crest, Tealby Close, Oasis Academy, Princes Street, Pelham Road and Kinloch Way and Cravens Lane at Habrough.
