Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for April

Crime

There were 75 crimes recorded for March in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT.

These included:

Domestic Burglary: 1

During the early hours of 12th March a garage at a home on Robert Close was entered after the door lock was forced. Tools were stolen.

Vehicle Crime: 3

Diesel was stolen from a lorry fuel tank whilst parked in a layby on the A 1173 between Immingham & Stallingborough during the early hours of 7th March.

During the evening of 19th March a Mercedes van was stolen from a company car park on Manby Road by-pass.

An attempt was made to steal a vehicle parked on Hadleigh Road during the early hours of 27th March. The ignition wires had been cut.

Damage - 11

Arson to outbuildings at 5 Acres Caravan Park on Immingham Road, Stallingborough.

Oasis Academy damage to kitchen window.

Humberston House damage to a car window and bodywork.

Hadleigh Road damage to a car after a can was thrown at it.

Highland Tarn damage to a car caused by a passer-by kicking the bodywork.

Damage to a car during a road rage incident.

Pelham Road damage to perimeter fencing of a company compound.

Hadleigh Road damage to a car.

Two domestic related offences.

Other crime include:

Thirteen assaults.

Eleven shop thefts. One male has been charged with theft in relation to two of these offences.

Six minor public order offences. Eight offences in relation to malicious communications.

Youths shining laser pens into homes on Highland Tarn x2.

Youths causing annoyance on Kennedy Way x2

Youths causing issues in a field at the rear of houses on Manby Road.

Pelham Road youths causing issues being abusive.

Neighbour dispute x2.
