Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for April

Crime

There were 64 crimes recorded for March in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT.

These included:

Residential Burglary:

A room at Beelsby House flats which is now empty was broken into on 25th March by forcing a locked door.

Commercial Burglary:

A quad bike was stolen from a shed sited in a field off Station Road Stallingborough overnight 20th & 21st March.

Vehicle Crime:

A truck parked in a layby on the A180 had its trailer tarpaulin slashed and contents rummaged about.

A car was parked on Queens Road whilst the driver collected a truck to work. On his return a week later, the car was missing.

Criminal Damage 7:

Windows were smashed at a house on Newark Walk.

A living room window was smashed at a home on Brewster Avenue after a brick was thrown.

Graffiti was sprayed on garden gates at a property on Church

Lane.

Tyres were slashed on a car parked on Thornbury Road.

Damage caused to Beelsby House.

One domestic related criminal damage.

Other crime includes:

Stainless steel pipes were stolen from a premises on Middleplatt Road. A staff member was injured after he tried to obstruct the escape.

A building site compound on the Habrough Park development was broken into and various building items stolen.

Eleven shop thefts. One male has been charged with one of these thefts. Another male is named as a suspect for another seven of the thefts.

Twenty one assaults.

Five minor public order offences.

There have been seven incidents of ASB reported.

Two incidents of youths causing issues in a passageway between Sonja Crest and Green Lane.

Two reports of youths causing issues at Beelsby House.

School girls making threats outside Oasis Academy.

Youths throwing objects from an overhead bridge on the A180.

One neighbour dispute.
