Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for August

Crime

Of the 82 crimes recorded for July in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT, there have been the following incidents:

Burglary Residential – 3

Between 13th & 19th July a window at the rear of a property on Stallingborough Road was smashed, however no entry was made.

On 15th July a shed was broken into at a property on Habrough Road. A strimmer was stolen.

Overnight 30th & 31st July a property on Church Lane was entered via an insecure front door. Keys to a car were taken which were then used to steal the vehicle.

Burglary Commercial – 3

Overnight 9th & 10th July a compound on North Moss Lane was entered. Entry was made to a PortaKabin where keys to a truck were removed. The keys were then used to steal a truck from the compound. The vehicle was later found in the Pontefract area.

A local man has been charged with burglary after entry was made through the delivery area of Home Bargains during the early hours of 22nd July.

Around midnight on 22nd July, a commercial premises on Manby Road was entered after intruders forced a hole in the roof to drop through into the premises. They were disturbed by the intruder alarm leaving empty handed.

Vehicle Crime – 6

Overnight 14th & 15th July two trucks loaded with charity goods parked at the rear of the Immingham Christian Centre were broken into and property stolen. The batteries for the vehicles were also stolen.

Overnight 23rd & 24th July lawnmower parts were stolen from a trailer parked at the Kiln Lane Industrial Estate.

During the early hours of 24th July a motor scooter was stolen from a property on Worsley Road. It was later recovered in the town.

Alloy wheels were stolen from a car loaded onto a car transporter parked in a layby on the A180 on 25th July.

Filler caps were stolen from excavators at the demolition site on Washdyke Lane over the last week, along with windows being smashed on some machinery. During the morning of 29th July a motorbike was stolen from a property on Pilgrim Avenue. The bike was later recovered in the town.

Damage – 14. Includes:

Jacks Store use lighter to burn an image into plastic cladding.
Clyfton Crescent concrete thrown from Green Lane damaging windows.
Carver Road throw stone at window of home causing damage x2.
Rose Gardens window smashed.
Newark Walk damage to car after known person jumps on bodywork.
Four domestic related offences.

Shop Theft – 1

Factory Shop x2, McColl's, Jacks, Poundstretcher.

Other crime include:

A male has been charged with attempted robbery following an incident on Aldi car park. The offender armed with a meat cleaver approached the victim and demanded his car keys. The victim refused, a brief struggle followed, resulting in the offender returning to his own vehicle empty handed and driving off. The male was caught following a lengthy pursuit.
Twenty one assaults.

ASB – 7

Youths hanging around on Roval Drive playing fields.
Princess Street youths throwing apples at an address.
Carver Road stones thrown at windows.
Roundway report of loud music.
Jacks Store males causing issues.
Green Lane youths throwing stones over hedges.
McColl's youths causing issues inside/outside the store.
