## Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for August

### Crime

Of the 54 crimes recorded for July in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT, there have been the following incidents:

#### **Burglary Residential – 2**

Overnight 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> July a garden shed at a home on Worsley Road was entered after forcing the door. Fishing gear was amongst the property stolen.

Overnight 14<sup>th</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup> July an attempt was made to enter an insecure garage on Alden Close. No entry was made but a lock was damaged.

#### **Burglary Commercial – 1**

Overnight 22<sup>nd</sup> & 23<sup>rd</sup> July an attempt was made to force the shutters on the Immingham Golf Club. No entry was made.

#### **Damage – 9**

Pelham Hotel a pane of glass in the door was smashed.

Lydford Road damage to a garden chair and door.

Bluestone Lane damage to a garage door.

Hadleigh Road damage to a fence.

Collier Road damage to a fence. Suspect arrested.

Alden Close rear windscreen of a car smashed.

Talbot Road damage to a bike and wall by deliberate use of a car.

Healing House damage caused within the family home during an argument.
