Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for August

Crime

There were 59 crimes recorded for July in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT.

These included:

Commercial Burglary 2:

On 2nd July a storage container at a compound on fields off Manby Road was entered and property from within was hidden in bushes ready to be taken away later. These were found by the owner and recovered. The keys to the container were stolen requiring the container locks to be changed.

During the evening of 8th July, two men forced entry to the B&M store. A quantity of alcohol was stolen. Two local men have been charged with burglary.

Criminal Damage 7:

Windows smashed at the Oasis Academy.

Windows smashed at a home on Margaret Street.

Wing mirrors kicked off a car parked on Talbot Road.

Beechwood Avenue use an implement to cause damage to the bodywork of a parked car.

Garden lights damaged at a garden on Pelham Road.

Other crime include:

On two separate occasions, two men have been charged with possession of a controlled drug in the town.

Two calves were removed from their field at South Marsh Road Stallingborough into another field where they were both slaughtered.

Nineteen assaults.

Nine public order offences.

Six shop thefts.

Theft of a garden statue from Winslow Drive.

Theft of a water feature from a garden on Steeping Drive.

ASB – 7 including:

Youths causing issues at the shop on Hadleigh Road x3.

Youths causing issues on & around Kennedy Way x2. Youths causing issues on Brocklesby Avenue x2.

Youths shooting a bb gun on Manby Road.

Neighbour disputes x8.
