Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for February

Crime

Of the 94 crimes recorded for January in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT, there have been the following incidents:

Burglary Residential – 7

During the early hours of 3rd January a burglary occurred at a home on Thornton Crescent after a door was forced. Electrical items were amongst the property stolen. The intruders were disturbed and left the address with the property. During the same period a garage and summer house on Highland Tarn had entry forced. Property was stolen. Two local juvenile males have been charged with these two offences.

During the afternoon of 19th January a home on Winslow Drive was entered after patio doors were forced. Property was stolen.

On the same day, a home on Clyfton Crescent was entered after a rear door was forced. Cash was stolen.

Overnight 22nd & 23rd January an attempt was made to force entry to an unoccupied house on Worsley Road by attacking the rear door. Damage was caused but no entry gained.

During the early evening of 25th January a resident disturbed an intruder in his home on Ferndown Drive. The intruder left the scene empty handed.

Between 23rd & 27th January a home on Atwood Close was entered via a bedroom window. Jewellery was stolen.

Burglary Commercial – 1

Between 7th & 9th January an attempt was made to force entry to shutters securing the rear of a shop on Waterworks Street. No entry was made

Vehicle Crime – 7

Overnight 1st & 2nd January a car parked on Margaret Street was entered after smashing the windscreen and side window. Internal damage was then caused to instruments.

Between 8th & 10th January there were seven thefts from motor vehicles. Pelham Road a catalytic converter was stolen. Tools were stolen from a van on Stallingborough Road.

Tools stolen from a van on St Andrews Way.

Tools stolen from a vehicle on Holbeck Place.

Custom bodywork parts were stolen from a van on Beechwood Avenue.

Catalytic converter stolen from a car parked on Sackville Road.

An HGV trailer which was left overnight 27th & 28th January in a layby off Manby Road was stolen.

Damage – 20

A male has been interviewed regarding damage to a car on 5th January and four commercial premises on Pelham Road on 12th & 13th January. He has been charged with three of these offences.

Damage to a fast food outlet on Kennedy way.

Brewster Avenue damage to a door.

Pelham Road damage to neighbouring windows.

Worsley road damage to door glass.

Harlech Walk damage to house windows.

Ferndown Drive damage to a door.

Talbot Road smash rear windscreen of car.

Pelham Road damage to a bus windscreen.

Pelham Road smash windscreen of car on drive.

Talbot Road smash car windscreen.

Clyfton Crescent damage to garden fence.

Kiln Lane Industrial Estate trailers have had curtain sides slashed to give access to trailer contents.

Other crime include:

The male charged with the offences of criminal damage has also been charged with two assaults, a shop theft, theft of a bike, racial abuse and public order offences. It is suspected that he is responsible for other offences of shop theft and public order related incidents. He is currently remanded in prison awaiting trial.

Another male was arrested for being in possession of a knuckle duster after he entered a local chip shop making threats. He has been recalled to prison.

A male has been recalled to prison after being arrested for being in possession of a knife.

Six further shop thefts.

Seven further assaults.
