Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for July

Crime

Of the 72 crimes recorded for June in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT, there have been the following incidents:

Burglary Residential – 1

During the evening of 22nd June a home off Station Road Stallingborough was entered via an insecure door. A handbag was stolen.

Vehicle Crime – 1

Over 1st & 2nd June a compound at the Stallingborough Industrial Estate was entered. A van which was loaded on to a transporter was removed from the transporter and driven away.

Damage – 4

Damage to security fencing at Habrough Fabrications.

Damage to car wing mirrors at Riby Layby x2.

Several curtain sided trailers were slashed at a compound on Manby Road.

Other crime include:

Police executed a search warrant under the misuse of drugs act at an address on Talbot Road. One male has been charged in connection with being concerned in the production of class B drugs.

Police executed a search warrant under the misuse of drugs act at an address on Owmbly Close. Two males have been charged in connection with being concerned in the production of class B drugs.

A male has been issued with a caution after being found in possession of cannabis.

Twenty nine assaults.

Seven minor public order offences. One male has been charged with one of these offences.

Three domestic related harassment offences.

Two shop thefts.
