## Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for July

### Crime

There were 55 crimes recorded for June in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT.

These included:

#### Residential Burglary:

During the early hours of 7<sup>th</sup> June a property on Healing Road Stallingborough was entered after a security chain securing a rear door was cut. The intruder made good his escape when he was disturbed by the resident.

#### Commercial Burglary:

During the afternoon of 23<sup>rd</sup> June a customer at then Bluestone Service Station managed to distract the staff member. In doing so, he managed to reach behind the counter screen and remove a couple of display boxes containing eCigs. The thief was rumbled, challenged, and returned all the stolen items before leaving the kiosk.

#### Vehicle Crime:

A Lexmoto motorbike was stolen from Hobson Way Stallingborough on the evening of 8<sup>th</sup> June whilst the owner was at work.

Front and rear number plates were stolen from a car parked on Pelham Road overnight 13<sup>th</sup> & 14<sup>th</sup> June.

On 20<sup>th</sup> June a Yamaha motorbike was stolen from the carpark at the County Hotel.

**Criminal Damage:**

A derelict farm building at Mauxhall farm was set alight on 14<sup>th</sup> June.

Damage to a driveway gate on Roundway.

Damage to a car caused by using an implement to scratch the paintwork at Somerton Road.

Damage caused to a bike by jumping on the wheels at Homestead Park.

Damage caused to windows of a bungalow on Kesteven Court, following on from previous incidents at then same address.

Damage caused to a shop window by punching it at the premises on Margaret Street.

**Other crime include:**

Eleven assaults.

Plant machinery was stolen from a secure compound on a building site off Kings Road after the security gate was cut away.

Five offences of making off without payment for fuel from Bluestone Service Station and the Luxmore Services.

Two shop thefts.

Five minor public order offences.

There have been five incidents of ASB reported.

Two reports of youths causing issues on the old golf course.

One report of motorbikes being ridden illegally. Youths throwing stones at windows at Healing House.

One neighbour dispute.
