Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for June

Crime

There were 82 crimes recorded for May in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT.

These included:

Residential Burglary:

Between 10th & 11th May an attempt was made to enter a garage on Alden Close. The door was forced but no entry gained.

On 17th May a relative went to check on a family home on Manby Road. On seeing the shed was insecure, he entered the shed to find an unknown male inside, who, when asked, refused to leave. Police were called and the male was subsequently arrested.

On 18th May, an attempt was made to enter a garage on Hamish Walk. Although damage was caused to the door, no entry was made.

Between 12th & 14th May a home on Rose Gardens was entered. Jewellery was stolen.

Commercial Burglary:

During the early hours of 10th May, intruders forced entry to Home Bargains store by removing boarding from a previous burglary. Goods were stolen.

Criminal Damage:

Damage to a property and vehicle on Kesteven Court, Habrough x2.

Brick thrown through a window at Langley Walk.

Two cars had their front and rear windscreen smashed at an address on Pelham Road.

Paving slab thrown through a window at an address on Pelham Road.

One domestic related criminal damage.

Other crime include:

A trailer laden with stainless steel was stolen from a haulage yard on the Kiln Lane Industrial Estate after the compound electronic gate was disarmed allowing access.

Seven assaults.

Three shop thefts.

Five minor public order offences.

There have been fifteen incidents of ASB reported.

Five reports of motorbikes being ridden illegally at various locations round Immingham.

Youths playing loud music on the field next to Shetland Way.

Youths causing issues on Roval Park field.
