Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for June

Crime

There were sixty two crimes recorded for the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough ward area in May. Of these, the following have occurred.

Residential Burglary:

Between 17th & 22nd May a renovated house at Highfield Farm was broken into. Electrical and plumbing fittings were damaged.

Vehicle Crime:

On 12th May a motorbike was stolen from a garden on Jersey Place.

During the early hours of 13th May a van parked on Pilgrim Avenue had its passenger side window smashed. Nothing was stolen.

Criminal Damage:

Damage to a vehicle parked on the Pelham Hotel carpark.

Damage to a garden cat scarer by kicking it off a wall. One youth has been dealt with for this offence.

Damage to a car window on Spinney Close.

Damage to a shop window on Kennedy Way.

Two domestic related criminal damages.

Other crime include:

Theft of steel cable from a crane on Immingham Docks.

Theft of scrap batteries form a premises on Kiln Lane.

Fifteen trailer curtain sides slashed looking for goods to steal.

Nothing has been stolen.

Two separate thefts of tyres from Bush Tyres on Manby Road.

Two shop thefts.

Five reports of harassment.

Six reports of sending malicious communications.

Eight minor public order offences.

Sixteen assaults.

There have been five incidents of ASB reported.

Motorbikes riding illegally around the park at Chapel Lane, Habrough. This was in fact two children riding toy electric bikes on the field supervised by their father.

Youths causing issues on Pilgrim Avenue.

Youths causing issues on Homestead Park. Youths causing issues outside Home Bargains.

One neighbour dispute.
