Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for March

Crime

Of the 55 crimes recorded for February in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT, there have been the following incidents:

Burglary Residential – 4

On 1st February a home on Church Lane was entered using a key taken from a caravan parked in the garden, property was stolen from the home.

During the early evening of 15th February a home on Pilgrims Way was entered by forcing patio doors. The property was searched.

Over the same period a property on Manby Road was entered, also by forcing patio doors. Jewellery was stolen.

Late on 22nd February, an unoccupied house on Pelham Road was entered by smashing a rear window. Nothing was stolen.

Burglary Commercial – 0

Vehicle Crime – 3

Overnight 11th & 12th February approx. 300 litres of fuel was stolen from a lorry parked up in a layby on the A180.

Between 15th & 19th February a car aerial was stolen from a vehicle parked at rose Gardens.

On 19th February, following a collision at Kiln lane Stallingborough, the male and female occupants of one of the vehicles involved were arrested for aggravated vehicle taking, driving under the influence of drink and drugs, and associated traffic offences.

Damage – 7

Pelham Hotel damage to an internal door.

Talbot Road damage to house windows. One juvenile male issued with a caution.

Ferndown Drive damage to a car following a road rage incident.

Scandinavia Way damage to a lorry fuel cap.

Two domestic related damages to properties.

Waterworks Street damage to a car windscreen.
