Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for May

Crime

Of the 43 crimes recorded for April in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT, there have been the following incidents:

Burglary Residential – 2

During the morning of 3rd April a male attended a property at Dawson Court Habrough to deliver a parcel. The male left the parcel, then opened the door slightly before he made off after he was disturbed by a dog. Nothing was stolen. Overnight 10th & 11th April it appears that an attempt was made to force entry to a home on Hume Brae, after a foot mark was found on the rear door near to the lock.

Vehicle Crime – 5

During the early hours of 7th April a Land Rover was stolen from Somerton Road. This vehicle is still outstanding.

Overnight 18th & 19th April four vehicles parked on Margaret Street, Shetland Way, Brewster Avenue and Worsley Road were entered and property stolen.

Damage – 6

Over the period of 14th to 17th April there have been four arsons reported where fires have been set in the empty blocks of flats awaiting demolition.

Pilgrims Way front window of house smashed.

Talbot Road three tyres slashed on a car.

Other crime include:

A man has been arrested and charged after being found by police in possession of a knife.

A male was arrested and charged with dangerous driving and possession of a class A drug following an incident that started after the male left a domestic incident in Grimsby and ended when the vehicle was stopped by use of a stinger on Stallingborough Road.
