Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for May

Crime

There were 78 crimes recorded for April in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT.

These included:

Residential Burglary:

An unoccupied house on Mauxhall Farm, Stallingborough Road has been entered and extensive damage caused when electrical wiring has been ripped out.

Commercial Burglary:

During the early hours of 16th April, three persons have broken into the Home Bargains store after smashing a window. Wheelie bins were used to remove property from the store.

Vehicle Crime:

Several males have been arrested after a number of cars were stolen from a compound on Stallingborough Industrial Estate on 6th April.

Criminal Damage 6:

A window was smashed at the shop on Hadleigh Road after a can of soup was thrown at it.

Windows were smashed at a property on Newark Walk following

an altercation between a group of men.

Damage to windows at a home on Steeping Drive by shooting air pellets at the windows.

Tiles have been damaged at a home on Newport Walk.

All four tyres were slashed on a car parked outside its address on Steeping Drive.

A fence panel was damaged at a garden on Church Lane.

Other crime includes: Two youths have been arrested in connection with arson where play equipment at Pilgrims Mount Play Park on Church Lane was set alight.

Seventeen shop thefts. Two brothers have been charged with six offences of theft, whilst a third local male has been charged with one. Eleven minor public order offences. Three making off without payment for fuel.

There have been fifteen incidents of ASB reported.

Seven reports of youths causing issues on Roval Park.

Two incidents of youths causing issues at Beelsby House in the communal area.

Two reports of youths causing issues at Aldi.

A youth banging on doors at Healing House.

Youths throwing eggs at properties on Hadleigh Road.

Motorbikes riding illegally on Ashtree Close.

Report of youths near the train line at Stallingborough.
