Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for October

Crime

Of the 61 crimes recorded for September in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT, there have been the following incidents:

Burglary Residential – 3

A domestic related burglary has been reported whereby the suspect has entered the home of his ex-partner through an insecure door. Damage was caused to property within the home.

Overnight 7th & 8th September a garage at a property on Chestnut Avenue was entered after forcing a window. Tools, bikes and motorcycle gear was stolen. Between 7am & 8am on 21st September an intruder attempted to force a lock and kick at a door to gain entry to a home on Woodapple Court, Stallingborough. No entry was made.

Burglary Commercial – 1

Between 15th & 16th September a break-in occurred at a warehouse on Immingham Dock. A forklift was taken, which was then used to load metal coils from another warehouse on to a vehicle which was then driven away.

Vehicle Crime – 3

Overnight 2nd & 3rd September a car parked on Eaton Road was entered and searched after smashing a window. Nothing was stolen.

Between 7th & 9th September a haulage yard on Kiln Lane was entered.

Containers on the back of three lorries were entered but nothing believed stolen.

Overnight 12th & 13th September £700 worth of diesel was stolen from a truck parked on a layby on the A180.

Damage – 10

Arson fire set on 2nd floor of derelict building on Park Close.

Damage caused to the derelict Immingham Golf Club.

Damage to windows on Park Close by youths throwing bricks.

Damage to windows at Jacks by youths throwing bricks.

Damage to roof tiles by youths throwing branches into a garden at Moreton Close.

Damage caused to car bodywork on Margaret Street.

Damage to car bodywork on Margaret Street.

Damage to car bodywork on Pelham Road.

Shop Theft – 10

Persons have been charged in relation to three of these offences. Offenders are identified in some of the other offences and will be dealt with in due course.

Other crime include:

A warrant issued under the Misuse of Drugs Act was executed by your local community officers at an address on Bluestone Lane. A quantity of drugs were recovered. A male has been interviewed in relation to this incident.

Theft of a bike from a garden on Ferndown Drive.

Four minor public order offences.

Four reports of harassment.

A juvenile prolific offender who has been very active committing crime in Immingham over the past year or so has finally been sentenced to 6 months detention.

Talbot Road ex-resident causing issues to a workman at a home.
