Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for October

Crime

Of the 68 crimes recorded for September in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT, there have been the following incidents:

Burglary Residential – 1

A known person stole a key from a property on Dunster Walk. The house holder had the locks changed. An attempt was later made to enter the home using the key but no entry gained.

A home on Pilgrims Way was entered overnight 26th & 27th September after a rear door was forced. Cash & Jewellery were amongst the property stolen.

Damage – 8

Damage to a window at the County Hotel.

Damage to a front door at an address on Queens Road.

Damage to windows at an address on Queens Road.

A car was set alight parked on the carpark on Alden Close.

A car windscreen was damaged whilst parked on Pelham Road after a known male jumped on the bonnet and stamped on the windscreen.

Off road motorbikes cause damage to a lawn at a premises on Queens Road.

Damage caused to CCTV cameras at Immingham Golf Club.

Vehicle Crime – 4

A truck parked in a lay-by on the A180 had its curtain side slashed. Electric leads belonging to the truck were stolen.

Number plates were stolen from a car parked at the rear of a shop on Kennedy Way.

An attempt was made to force entry to a transit van by forcing the window. The offender was disturbed who made good his escape.

A VW Caravelle was stolen from outside an address on Somerton Road overnight 29th & 30th September.

Other crime include:

A male has been charged with Dangerous Driving following an incident where the vehicle he was driving failed to stop for police. The vehicle was stopped using tactical measures. Ten assaults. Six of these were domestic related. A male has been charged with an assault and breach of restraining order on one of these

incidents, whilst another male has been charged with assault following during another incident.

Fourteen minor public order offences.

Seven shop thefts, four at Jacks with the same named suspect.

ASB – 23 Including:

Motorbikes being ridden illegally x6.

YCA Kennedy Way x2.

COVID breaches x2.

Fly tipping behind Heron on Kennedy Way.

Cars being driven erratically around Kennedy Way car park.

Youths causing annoyance on Blair Walk.

Fireworks being set off on Hadleigh Road.

Kids putting traffic cones into road disrupting traffic.

Two boys throwing apples into the road on Washdyke Lane.

Objects thrown at a house on Magnolia Rise.

Girl being shot at by BB gun on the boat park.
