Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for October

Crime

There were 76 crimes recorded for September in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT.

These included:

Commercial Burglary 2:

A male has been charged with burglary after he entered the premises of Little London Motors and stole a set of car keys.

On 12th September barns at Mauxhall Farm were entered.

Damage was caused when wheat grain was thrown outside and left to spoil.

Vehicle Crime 6:

On 3rd September persons approached two trucks parked in a yard on Kiln Lane Industrial Estate. Attempts were made to force the engine grill to access the engine to start it. Both containers on the trailers had been opened but nothing was stolen.

An ex-employee attended his ex-workplace and stole a Transit van. The male was subsequently arrested for the offence. On 3rd September a Subaru Forrester was stolen from the driveway of an address on Church Lane. The vehicle was later found burnt out.

On 5th September a male stole some keys from a car sales which were used to later steal a car. He was later charged with this

offence.

A car that had been left in a layby on the A180 after it had broken down was stolen. Overnight 12th & 13th September.

An employee drove a works vehicle home and failed to return to work. The employee later stated that the vehicle had been stolen.

Criminal Damage 4:

Damage to a car on Hadleigh Road by smashing a window during an argument.

In a separate incident another car was damaged on Hadleigh Road when a window was smashed.

All four tyres were slashed on a car parked on Margaret Street.

A male has been charged with causing damage to a wooden fence at Little London Farm Shop.

Other crime includes:

Seventeen assaults.

Eighteen public order offences.

Four shop thefts. One male has been charged with theft from Aldi.

Three offences of sending malicious communications.

ASB 3:

Vehicles being driven on the old golf course x2.

Complaint of cars driving up and down the main road through Habrough during the early hours.

Jersey Place motorbikes riding on nearby fields.

Kennedy Way youths causing annoyance x3.
