Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for September

Crime

Of the 69 crimes recorded for August in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT, there have been the following incidents:

Burglary Residential – 1

.During the morning of 19th August an attempt was made to force the lock from a garage door at a row of garages on Carisbrooke Walk. No entry was made.

Burglary Commercial – 3

During the early hours of 2nd August the Timber Specialists on Manby Road Industrial Estate was entered. Wood was piled up ready to remove.

About 3am on 11th August the PoundStretcher store was broken in after a window was smashed to gain entry. Items were stolen from the till area.

Just before midnight on 19th August the B&M store on Kennedy Way was broken into after smashing a window to gain entry. Perfume & alcohol were stolen.

About 1.20am on 25th August PoundStretcher was again broken into in the same manner. Groceries were stolen.

Damage – 4

Damage was caused to a room at the Silver City Hotel by a female resident. She has been charged with this and an assault from the same incident.

Three domestic related incidents of damage within the home.

Vehicle Crime – 1

Sometime during the day of 6th August, a car was stolen from outside its address on Pelham Road. The vehicle is still outstanding.

Other crime include:

Thirty three assaults. Six of these were domestic related. Six were committed by the same person against six different members of staff at the place he was being cared for. Three were committed at a gathering of people where the offender has assaulted three different people.

Five minor public order offences.

Three shop thefts, one with a named suspect.

Theft of artificial lawn from the rear garden of a home on Pelham Road.

Theft of wheelie bins from Rose Gardens.

ASB – 21 Including:

Motorbikes being ridden illegally around various locations in Immingham x 13.

Neighbour disputes x4.

Sainsbury's reporting issues with a homeless male.

Youths smashing glass being loud and abusive on Washdyke Lane.

Report of drunken teenage girls on Homestead Park.

Report of a beggar outside PoundStretcher.
