## Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for September

### Crime

There were 59 crimes recorded for August in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT.

These included:

#### Domestic Burglary 3:

During the early hours of 13<sup>th</sup> August somebody attempted to open a rear door at a property on Somerton Road. This person was disturbed by the householder and made off from the premises.

Also on this date, a garden shed at a property on Station Road Stallingborough was entered after the padlock was forced. Several items of property were stolen.

On 31<sup>st</sup> August an attempt was made to enter a rear door at a property on Talbot Road. No entry was gained.

#### Commercial Burglary 1:

A lock-up store within a horse yard on Roxton Lane was broken into on 8<sup>th</sup> August. Various horse items were stolen.

#### Criminal Damage 8:

Damage to a fence and carport after a neighbour lit a fire too close to the boundary.

Doors were damaged at the sports pavilion on Chapel Lane

Habrough.

Windows at a house, the doorway to a shop, and car bodywork were damaged in three separate incidents on Hadleigh Road.

Damage to a fence on Somerton Road.

Damage to a fuel pump at Luxmore Service Station when a male turned up at closing time, put the nozzle in the car, demanded to staff to open up again. When he was refused, the male drove off with the nozzle still in the cart tank.

One domestic related damage to a garden gate.

Other crime includes:

A male was arrested and later charged for being in possession of a bladed article after being stopped by police officers on Church Lane.

Persons removed a perimeter fence to gain entry into a yard at the Stallingborough Industrial Estate. They unhitched a tractor unit from a trailer, then hitched up a tractor unit they brought with them to the trailer and drove away from the site.

A male has received a caution for being found in possession of heroin.

On a separate occasion, another male has received a Cannabis warning after being found in possession of the drug.

Twelve minor public order offences.

Twelve assaults.

ASB 3:

Youths playing football on the grassed area next to the Mayflower Pub.

Youths egging houses on Hadleigh Road.

Youths on Church Park causing issues.
