Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for August

Crime

There were 72 crimes recorded for July in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT.

These included:

Residential Burglary:

On 15th July a domestic related burglary occurred whereby an ex-partner entered a home uninvited and stole a mobile phone. Around teatime on 19th July a home on Langley Walk was entered by unknown means. Cash was stolen from an upstairs bedroom.

Vehicle Crime:

During the evening of 14th July a Yamaha motorbike was stolen from outside its address on Hollingsworth Avenue. Overnight 22nd & 23rd July, a compound on the Kiln Lane Industrial Estate was entered by cutting the gate locks. A loaded trailer was stolen. During the early hours of 24th July, an attempt was made to break into a vehicle parked on its driveway on Stallingborough Road. The would be thief was disturbed by the homeowner and ran away before entry could be made.

Criminal Damage:

About 4.00am on 24th July a car parked on Hadleigh Road was set

alight. This in turn caused two other vehicles parked nearby to catch fire.

Car had two tyres punctured on Woodlands Avenue.

Windows smashed at a property on Talbot Road.

Three domestic related criminal damages.

Other crime include:

Fourteen assaults.

Eight offences of making off without payment for fuel from Bluestone Service Station, Manby Road Service Station, and the Luxmore Services.

Seven minor public order offences.

Six offences of sending malicious communications.

Four shop thefts.

There have been eight incidents of ASB reported.

Three reports of motorbikes being ridden illegally at various locations.

Youths on bikes causing issues around the Rose Gardens complex.

Youths causing issues at Aldi's carpark.

Youths being noisy on Roval Drive.

Youths throwing stones at Oasis Academy.

One neighbour dispute.
