Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for September

Crime

There were 60 crimes recorded for August in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT.

These included:

Residential Burglary:

During the afternoon of 23rd August the Bert Boyden Centre was entered through a fire door leading to a corridor. No further entry was gained into the building and the intruders left.

Vehicle Crime:

Overnight 6th & 7th August a wing mirror was stolen from a car parked on Pilgrims Way.

Overnight 29th & 30th August a Ford Transit Tipper was stolen from outside it's address on Station Road Stallingborough.

Criminal Damage:

On two separate occasions a field at South Marsh Road Stallingborough has been set alight, which has needed to Fire Service to attend on both occasions to extinguish them.

A gas box was broken into at an address on Waterworks Street.

Car windscreen smashed on Pelham Road.

A brick was thrown through a window on Langley Walk.

Window smashed at a property on Princess Street.

Other crime includes:

Theft of a trailer loaded with a mini digger from a construction site on Immingham Dock.

Twelve assaults.

Eight minor public order offences.

Five shop thefts.

One make off without payment for fuel.

Four offences of harassment.

Two offences of sending malicious communications.

There have been eight incidents of ASB reported.

Three reports of youths causing issues around Kennedy Way and the shops.

Two reports of youths on Roval Drive causing issues. Homestead Park youths causing issues at the lake, swimming, throwing things at birds.

Youths at the shop on Hadleigh Road intimidating other customers.

One neighbour dispute.
