## Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for November

### **Crime**

There were 59 crimes recorded for October (to date 26<sup>th</sup>) in the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough area of the NPT. These included:

#### **Residential Burglary:**

Overnight 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> October a summer house in a garden on Princess Street was entered. Three amplifiers were stolen.

#### **Commercial Burglary:**

During the early hours of 23<sup>rd</sup> October two males were monitored on CCTV walking round the Home Bargains Store. One of the persons then threw a brick at the glass doors smashing the glass, however they ran away when the intruder alarm sounded.

#### **Vehicle Crime:**

Overnight 14<sup>th</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup> October both front and rear number plates were stolen from a car parked on the Imperial Ford Forecourt.

#### **Criminal Damage:**

Tyres were punctured on a car parked at Homestead Park. Youths caused damage to a bus shelter on Pelham Road by kicking the Perspex screen.

Vehicle windscreen smashed on Manby Road.

House window smashed on Manby Road.

One domestic related criminal damage.

Other crime include:

During the early evening of 20<sup>th</sup> October a lorry entered a yard on Immingham Dock and stole a trailer laden with whiskey and Clothing.

Eight assaults.

Nine minor public order offences.

Six shop thefts.

Seven offences of sending malicious communications.

Three reports of harassment.

There have been nine incidents of ASB reported.

Three reports of youths causing issues around Kennedy Way and the Civic Centre.

One report in relation to the illegal riding of motorbikes on Pelham Road.

A male causing a scene at Bluestone Services.

Four neighbour disputes.
